 - To date, we have assembled information about a subset of states with recently active statewide committees or taskforces

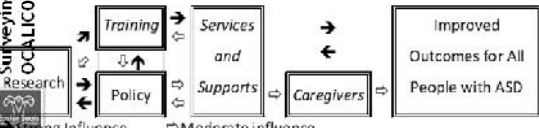

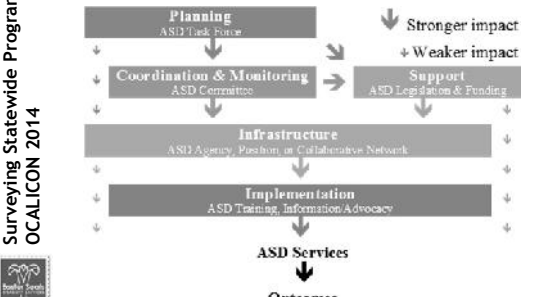
How policy influences outcomes

- Science impacts outcomes only through improved policy, training, & services
 - Training & service rely on specific programs
 - Consider training & service for caregivers too!
 - Training & services can shape policy & research




ROLE OF THE STATE

Path to sustainable impact




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STATEWIDE PLANNING ASD Task Force

- Time limited committees that generate action plan
 - ✓ Some focused on one domain (education) OR Are cross/multi-agency
- Planning may lead directly to improved infrastructure/support BUT may work better with ongoing coordination via a Committee


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STATEWIDE PLANNING ASD Task Force: Key Elements

- Evidence of 48 task forces in 36 (72%) of states
 - AL; **AR**; **AZ**; **CA**; CO; CT; DE; FL; GA; HI; **IL**; IN; KS; KY; MD; ME; MN; MO; MS; MT; NC; **ND**; NE; NH; NJ; NV; NY; OH; OK; OR; PA; RI; **TN**; TX; WA; WI
 - Those with an active task force are in bold
- Key element: Mandate by legislature
 - 31 (65%) of task forces; 29 (82%) of states
 - **ALL BUT** MO; MT; NE; NY; OK; PA; WI


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STATEWIDE PLANNING ASD Task Force: Key Elements

- Transparency: Described on website maintained by host agency
 - 17 (35%) task forces; 14 (39%) states
 - AL; AR; AZ; CA; CO; FL; IN; KY; MD; MN; ND; NY; RI; WA
 - Good: a) List of participants; b) mandate (including legislation) 4 task forces (9%); 4 (11%) of states
 - CA; KY; MD; WA
 - Better: c) Meeting agenda/minutes; d) final report: 4 task forces (9%); 4 (11%) of states
 - IN; KY; MD; ND
 - 1 task force met a-d above criteria: MD


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STATEWIDE PLANNING ASD Task Force: Key Elements

- Participation beyond state agencies: Less than 50% voting members
- Voice for advocates: Participants include
 - Good: Parents OR Self-Advocates OR Representatives from Advocacy groups
 - Better: Parents AND Self-Advocates AND Representatives from Advocacy groups
 - Best: These constituted at least 1/3 voting members


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STATEWIDE PLANNING ASD Task Force: Key Elements

- Data based: Needs assessments OR actual data on services utilized
- Anticipates implementation
 - Good: A committee or agency is designated to report back regarding overall progress
 - Better: PLUS recommendations are supplemented by specific strategies or action steps
 - Best: PLUS Recommendations are assigned to specific agencies


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STATEWIDE COORDINATION Standing ASD committees

- Committees that direct state strategy: More heft if
 - ✓ They are mandated via state legislation
 - ✓ They report back to the state legislature
- Committee can build on the work of a task force or lead directly to improved infrastructure/support
 - BUT is not well placed to directly implement programs of services, training, or research


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STATEWIDE COORDINATION Standing ASD committees

- We found 28 committees in 25 (50%) of states, with 23 (96%) of these states having a committee that is active (in bold text):
 - AK; AL; CO; CT; DE; IA; IN; KS; KY; MA; MD; MO; MS; NE; NH; NJ; NV; OH; OR; RI; TX; VA; VT; WA; WI**
- ✓ Sub-committees with specific mandates

Key elements described for Task Forces apply to Committees: how are they different?




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STATEWIDE COORDINATION ASD Committees: Key Elements

- Committee is mandated
 - 21 of 28 committees had a mandate (75%), in 21 (88%) of the 24 states with a committee
 - All but OH; RI; WA; WI**
 - Good: Recommended by task force: 9 (32%) committees, in 9 (38%) states
 - CO; CT; DE; IN; KY; MS; NE; NH; NV
 - Better: Mandated by legislature: 17 (61%) committees, in 16 (67%) states
 - All but DE; IN; NE; NV; OH; RI; WA; WI**
 - 5 committees mandated using both means
 - CO; CT; KY; MS; NH;




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STATEWIDE COORDINATION ASD Committees: Key Elements

- Transparency: Activities are available on a website maintained by the agency
 - Websites for 21 of 28 (75%) committees, or in 20 (80%) of 24 states with a committee
 - All but AK; DE; KS; MS; NV**
 - Good: a) Mandate or legislation described 11 committees (39%) in 11 (44%) states
 - AL; CO; IA; IN; MA; NH; NJ; OH; OR; TX; VA




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STATEWIDE COORDINATION ASD Committees: Key Elements

- Better: b) Participants are listed - In 14 committees (50%) in 14 (67%) states
 - AL; CT; IA; IN; MA; NH; NJ; OH; OR; RI; TX; VA; VT; WI;
- Best: c) Annual/biennial reports or d) Meeting agenda/minutes are available - In 8 committees (29%) in 8 (33%) states
 - AL; IO; MA; NH; NJ; OR; TX; VT
- 7 committees met all criteria (a-d above)
 - AL; IO; MA; NH; NJ; OR; TX




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STATEWIDE COORDINATION ASD Committees: Key Elements

- Monitors implementation
 - Better: A committee or agency is designated to report back regarding overall progress
 - Best: Reports document progress towards specific recommendations





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STATEWIDE SUPPORT Funding: Agencies & Services

- Many direct services rely on state \$\$ to a significant if not major degree
 - May also be affected by rules/regulations (reimbursement rates for specific services)
- Indirect/support services provided by state agencies depend even more on state \$\$
 - Outreach / information
 - Training
 - Level of oversight
 - Capacity to develop new programs







STATEWIDE SUPPORT
Funding: Health Insurance

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- Many states have passed private insurance legislation
 - ✓ Look carefully at regulations about what kinds of businesses and policies are exempt
 - ✓ Follow-up to ensure that families can access benefits they are entitled to
- Shape impact of Affordable Care Act
 - ✓ Act on caps on \$ (though not hours) on essential health services (inc. behavioral health) prohibited by ACA

STATEWIDE SUPPORT
Funding: Waivers

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- Access federal funding for specific kinds of direct services and supports IF states
 - Commit to matching levels of funding
 - Comply with necessary regulations
- Many states have waiting lists (some very long) for some waiver services

STATEWIDE SUPPORT
Other legislation

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- Certification: Can create, recognize, or mandate specific types of training
 - Recognize a professional group (i.e. BCBA's)
 - Endorse a specialized certificate (post-graduate ASD teacher training)
 - Require that a specific training program be completed for a specific task (i.e., FBAs)

STATEWIDE SUPPORT
Other legislation

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- Agency Mandates: Specific regulations may interfere with needed services
 - Align medical diagnosis and educational classification
 - Allow behavioral health services to provide "habilitation"
 - Promote active collaboration between school and home
- Other specific guidance and oversight
 - ✓ Seclusion and restraint

STATEWIDE INFRASTRUCTURE
ASD State Agencies

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- Specific Bureaus, offices, or divisions housed within in state govt to address ASD issues
 - Complete office/division, full staff complement
 - 14 State Agencies in 12 different states
 - AK; CT; DE; MA; MO; NJ; NV; PA; RI; SC; TX; UT; WI;
- ASD designated positions
 - Isolated position identified as specifically focusing on ASD
 - Three states: CO; NJ; TN


STATEWIDE INFRASTRUCTURE
ASD Collaborative Networks

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- A non-state agency which receives designated state funding to offer service, training, or information/advocacy on a statewide basis
 - 25 Collaborative Networks in 22 different states
 - AK; CT; FL; IA; ID; IL; IN; KY; LA; MD; MI; MT; NC; NE; NY; OH; OK; OR; SC; VA; WV




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STATEWIDE IMPLEMENTATION ASD Information/Advocacy

- Service is offered through a physical or virtual (e.g., web-based) resource center
 - Focused here on agencies or networks that offer more than generic links to information or resources available elsewhere
 - This service can be provided by a state agency or collaborative network
- All but 1 of 39 networks have a website
 - 29 (74%) of the 39 websites in 22 states offer one element from A-D below
 - AK; CT; FL; IA; ID; IL; IN; KY; MA; MD; MI; MO; MT; NC; NE; NJ; NV; NY; OH; OK; OR; PA; RI; SC; TX; UT; WV;




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STATEWIDE IMPLEMENTATION ASD Information/Advocacy

- Disseminate information
 - A) Statewide events / activities: 13 (33%)
 - B) State policies, committees, reports: 15 (38%)
 - C) Breaking news about research and policy at the national level: 11 (28%)
- D) Connect families w/ resources: 19 (49%)
 - Several have online searchable resource guides
- Most complete resource centers (at least 3 of A-D above): CT, IL, IN, OH, MO, OK, PA, TX, WV




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STATEWIDE IMPLEMENTATION ASD Training Programs

- Develop/disseminate training activities or programs intended for statewide impact
 - More than occasional invited speakers or workshops
 - Training program can be provided by a state agency or collaborative network
- 25 (74%) of 39 programs in 21 states offer at least one element from A-I below
 - AK; CT; FL; IA; ID; IL; IN; KY; LA; MI; MO; NE; NY; OH; OK; PA; RI; SC; TX; VA; WV;




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STATEWIDE IMPLEMENTATION ASD Training Programs

- A) General workshops in basic awareness for a broad audience: 19
- B) Statewide Conference: 12
- C) More specific, discipline/topic-specific workshops (Screening/diagnosis, etc.): 9
- D) Series of workshop: 6 (PBS, paraprofessionals, etc)
- E) ASD Course: 7




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STATEWIDE IMPLEMENTATION ASD Training Programs

- F) Mentoring/Coaching: 5
- G) Model sites: 3
- H) Develop or endorse practice guidelines: 3
- I) Train-the-trainer programs: 2
- 12 agencies in 11 states offered 3 to 7 of the above
 - AK, DE, IN, KY, MI, MO, NE, OH, PA, SC, TX





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STATEWIDE IMPLEMENTATION Services

- Regional Collaboratives: Some states are too large for a single statewide entity to reach everyone
 - Support or mandate regional center to provide more specialized services
 - Create regional training networks
- Specialized Services for those with especially challenging behaviors:
 - Specialized residential programs
 - Intensive case management and coordination







OTHER STATEWIDE PROGRAMS
Registries

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- Intended to get a “count” of number of people with ASD
 - Q’s: How is this better than CDC estimates?
- Implementation varies
 - Sometimes reporting is anonymous: no possibility to verify diagnosis
 - Sometimes reporting is mandated
- Ultimate goal varies from state to state
 - Get a “true” count of the need?
 - Connect families with research or other services
- ✓ Option: Census of those receiving services
 - PA 2009 Census



OTHER STATEWIDE PROGRAMS
Research

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- Statewide Needs Assessment: Many states informally gather information regarding satisfaction, gaps, and needs
 - Focus groups, surveys posted on a website
 - But is this representative enough? Population-based surveys invite everyone identified with a need to participate
- A handful of states set aside funds for targeted research
 - Always related to services (Evaluate a pilot intervention program)
